




The CSU


Academic Progression

- Majority of instruction primarily remote
- Exceptions made for limited on-site instructions
- Flexibility with labs and clinicals (e.g. AB2288)
- Only one program suspended admissions (East Bay Nursing)
- Majority students on track to graduate on time

- Concurrent Enrollment Program Expansion
- Apprenticeships
- Medical School Pipeline
- Public Health Workforce Education and Training
- Vaccination Clinics



Concurrent Enrollment Program Expansion

- Addressing ADN to BSN challenges
- One newly established partnership between Evergreen Valley College and San José State
- Newly established collaboration between Los Angeles Regional Nursing Curriculum Consortium and Dominguez Hills, Long Beach, Los Angeles and Northridge

Apprenticeship

 Newly formed collaboration between Department of Labor and Department of Apprenticeship Standards

Addressing needs to high-skilled apprenticeships

 Establishing Clinical Laboratory Scientist (San Jose) and Cybersecurity (San Bernardino) apprenticeships



Medical School Pipeline

- Campus linkage agreement with Medical
- California Medical Scholars
- CSU and Keck Graduate Institute pathway



Public Health Workforce

- System-wide partnership with California Department of Public Health
- Paid internship for students
- Professional development for students and faculty
- Proposal for state funded workforce, education and training



COVID-19 Vaccinations

- 11 of 23 campuses serve as vaccine distribution sites
- Many staffed by faculty and students
- Partnerships with county and private entities for academic opportunities




