Initiative Purpose

- To develop and implement a road map for the development of regional health workforce collaboratives across California, providing support through convening, connection, coordination and technical assistance, and elevating regional priorities for state policy and systems change.
- To promote a more robust, diverse, inclusive and culturally responsive health workforce and greater health career opportunity for residents through support of regional health workforce collaboratives in California.

- Develop a road map and action plan with extensive stakeholder engagement. Annual plan updates.
- HCC will establish and be informed by a diverse advisory council
- HCC will develop a workforce division with sufficient capacity


- HCC conducts a landscape analysis with stakeholder engagement
- HCC develops assessments of current regional collaboratives and opportunities for capacity building, technical assistance, information sharing, and collaboration.
- Priority geographic areas include the Inland Empire, Central Valley and rural parts of the state.
- Identify regions with gaps and opportunities for collaborative development

- Support CHPC as the coordinating statewide coalition
- Convene and enhance coordination, connection and collaboration among regional collaboratives, in conjunction with CHPC.
- Collaborate with UCSF Healthforce and HCAI to inform statewide policy considerations and issues key to regional collaborative success

- Provide technical assistance in support of collaboratives.
- Support development of multi-year regional collaborative plans and models to increase scale, sustainability and impact
- Regrant funds to invest in collaborative and program scale, sustainability and impact expansion.
- Connect the dots with and leverage other funding sources and relevant workforce, education, economic development initiatives

- Create and support a more formal, coordinated ecosystem for supporting people to gain linked, sequential support as they advance through their education and health career journeys.
- Support evaluation of and across regional collaboratives.
- Assist with telling the story and changing the narrative regarding collaboratives and pathway programs and required investment
- Consider other Oct pathway convening recommendations
