
What is mental health?

Mental health, as defined by the World Health Organization, is "a state of well-being in which every individual realizes his or her own potential, can cope with the normal stresses of life, can work productively and fruitfully, and is able to make a contribution to his or her community."



Behavioral Health Versus Mental Health -What's the Difference?

Behavioral health describes the connection between the health and well-being of the body and the mind.





Mental health, which is one area of behavioral health, can include a variety of factors, such as biology, psychological state, and habits.

When choosing a career in behavioral health you should know....

Growth in an industry

- According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor and Statistics "Employment of substance abuse, behavioral disorder, and mental health counselors is projected to grow 25 percent from 2019 to 2029, much faster than the average for all occupations."
- California projected annual job openings of 4850 from 2018-2028

California Wages

On average of those employed as Substance Abuse, Behavioral Disorder, and Mental Health Counselors/Therapist earn on average \$50,090 (\$24.08/hr) annually. With an annual high earnings of \$96,920 (\$46.60/hr).

FACT

- We all experience different levels of mental health throughout our lives.
 - Depression is the leading cause of disability worldwide.
 - > Over 44 million American adults (18.07%), have a mental health condition.
 - Less than 50% of U.S. adults with mental illness received treatment in 2018.
 - ▶ 1 in 6 U.S. youth aged 6-17 experience a mental health disorder each year

Peer providers, (e.g., peer support specialists, recovery coaches) are people who use their experience of recovery from mental health and/or substance use disorders to support others in recovery.

Alcohol & Drug Counselor (Substance Use Disorder Counselor)

Alcohol & Drug Counselor or substance abuse counselors work closely with individuals and groups to identify problem behaviors and offer solutions. Their focus is on the world of addiction and its far-reaching effects, with the aim of assisting patients in finding the right path to recovery and staying on that path for as long as possible.

Associate Professional Clinical Counselor (APCC)

An Associate (prior to licensure) Professional clinical counselors (APCC) focus primarily on the needs of patients as individuals with the purpose of improving mental health, though they may also work with families and in group settings. Through a broader scope of intervention, APCCs diagnose and treat individual patients living with mental and emotional illness, substance abuse, disability, personal trauma, and psychological and social developmental disorders.

Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW)

A LCSW is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker. These professionals work in a wide variety of settings to provide emotional support, mental health evaluations, therapy and case management services to people experiencing psychological, emotional, medical, social and/or familial challenges.

Licensed Clinical Psychologist

A Licensed Clinical Psychologist is a professional who can work in a wide variety of settings to help people learn to cope with stressful situations, overcome addictions, manage their chronic illnesses. They also provide tests and assessments that can help diagnose a condition or tell more about the way a person thinks, feels, and behaves. These tests may evaluate intellectual skills, cognitive strengths and weaknesses, vocational aptitude and preference, personality characteristics, and neuropsychological functioning.

Psychiatric-Mental Health Nurse Practitioner

A Psychiatric-Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMHNPs) is an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse (APRN) who provide comprehensive mental health care to patients suffering from behavioral problems and mental health disorders. Not only do PMHNPs provide diagnostic care and treatment, they also focus on psychiatric/mental health maintenance and wellness. They use both medicinal and therapeutic interventions in treatment plans to help patients.
